

Registration Methods

Participants may register for this course using one of the following four methods:

Online

Registration Policies

Registrations are accepted on a first come, first serve basis. Registration for this course will close

Registrations are not confirmed until payment has been received.

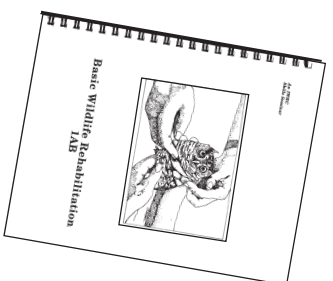
Registrants under 18 years of age must submit a signed permission slip in order to participate. Forms can be obtained by contacting the IWRC office.

Refunds for cancellations must be requested by **April 20, 2007**.

Requests for credits or transfers may be made up until two days after the class date. No-shows who do not contact the IWRC office by **May 23, 2007** will forfeit their registration fee.

In the event of cancellation, the registrant retains the manual, at a cost of \$30.

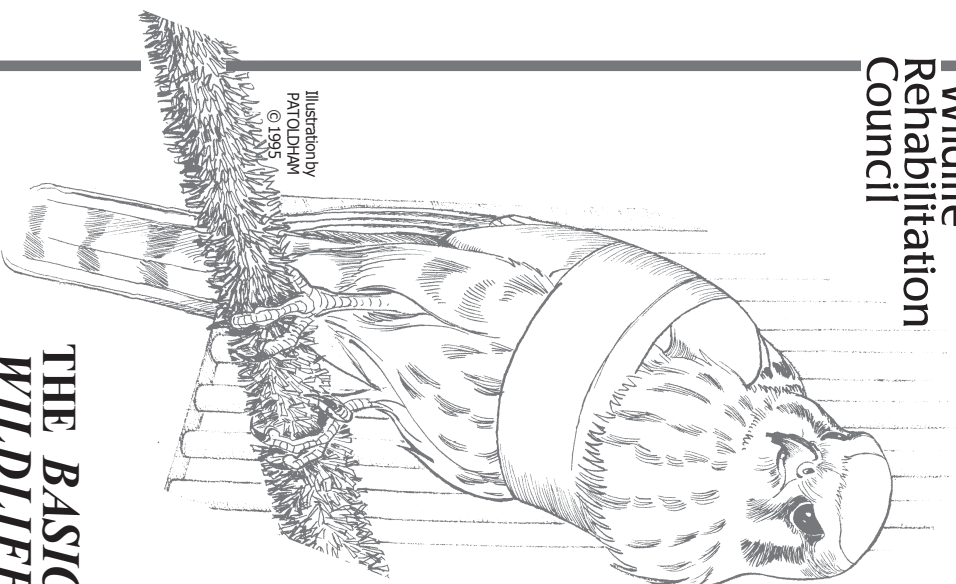

The Logistics

The International Wildlife Rehabilitation Council has scheduled a *Basic Wildlife Rehabilitation* course in your area. This course is designed to help meet the continuing education needs of wildlife care professionals.

The two day course is scheduled for May 19 & 20, 2007, from 8:30am - 5:30pm both days.

Carolina Wildlife Care is the local host for this course, which will be held at the the **University of South Carolina.**

The Curriculum

Basic Wildlife Rehabilitation is a two-day introductory course consisting of 8 hours lecture and 4 hours lab. Topics covered in the course include:

- **Introduction to Wildlife Rehabilitation**
- **Basic Anatomy and Physiology**
- **Calculating Drug Dosages**
- **Handling and Physical Restraint**
- **Basic Nutrition**
- **Avian Neonatal Care**
- **Zoonoses**
- **Housing and Criteria for Release**
- **Euthanasia**

Lab topics include:

- **Basic Physical Examination**
- **Physical Restraint**
- **IM and Sub Q Injections**
- **Limb Immobilization**
- **Gavage**

Participants pass the course based on three criteria: 1) Passing score on the final exam, 2) Passing score on the homework, 3) full participation in the class. Those who pass receive a certificate of completion.

IWRC courses are accepted by most regulating agencies for educational requirements. Please check with your local agency for individual regulations.
